

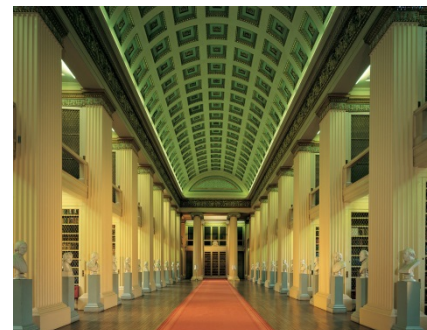

DAFx17 is hosted by the University of Edinburgh. This will be the 20th occasion for DAFx, which has been running since 1998. Attendees include academics, students, and representatives from the music technology industry.



Probably you or colleagues of yours have already attended a DAFx conference in the past, or downloaded one of the many DAFx scientific publications from the internet thanks to the longstanding DAFx “Open Access” policy. For DAFx17, we expect at least 100 international participants and the paper sessions will be concerned with audio signal processing techniques for music, sound art, acoustics and related applications, both in software and hardware. The conference will be held from Tuesday the 5th of September until Friday the 8th of September in Edinburgh, UK. There will be tutorials on the first day and paper sessions on the other days. Saturday the 9th of September will be an optional day reserved for exploring Scotland.
